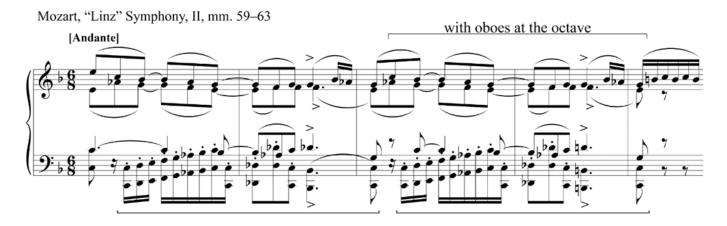

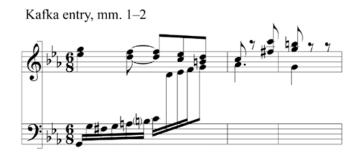

Example 3. Comparison between the *Entführung* overture, mm. 223–40 (upper system), and the Kafka entry, mm. 3–6 (lower system)



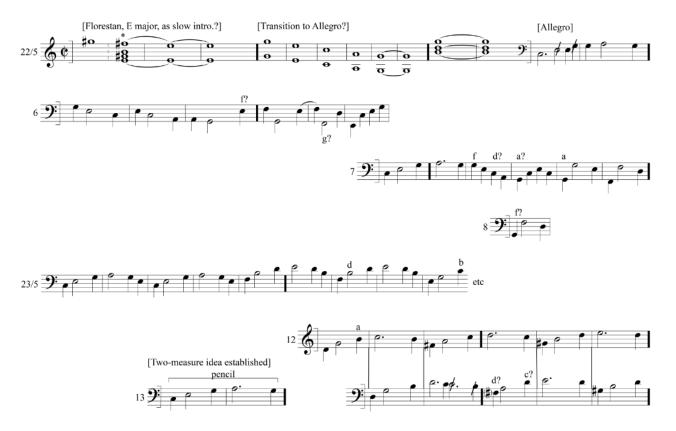
Example 4. Landsberg 10, sketch for *Leonore* No. 2, Allegro theme

Example 6. Landsberg 10, sketches for the Allegro theme of L2, part 1

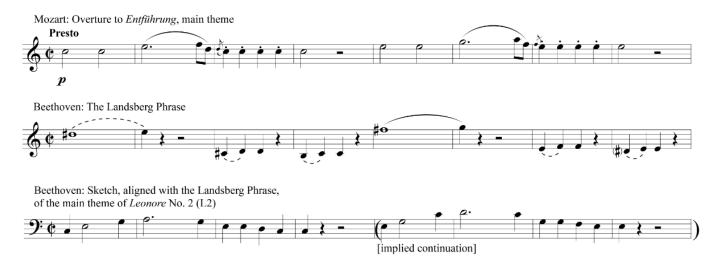
