



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

Verse*






Example 7. Number of drum patterns per song




Example 8. Number of drum pattern changes per song



Example 9. Average number of drum patterns and drum pattern changes per song by year

























PRIMARY SYMBOLS

Low Layer

standard rock (R)
four-on-the-floor (4)
tresillo (T)

Middle Layer

backbeat (B)
straight four (4)
tresillo (T)

High Layer

eighth notes (8)
sixteenth notes (16)
quarter notes (4)

All Layers

other (O)
hybrid (variable)
absent (X)

AUXILIARY SYMBOLS

Surface Rhythm: plus (+) and minus (-) symbols depict comparative amounts of surface rhythm embellishment

Instrumentation: abbreviated superscripts indicate instrumentation other than bass drum, snare drum, and hi-hat

Drum Feel: normal-time feel is assumed and parenthetical addendums express half-time feel (HT) and double-time feel (DT)
